Guide for Authors

The quarterly journal of *Razavi Heritage* uses online submission only. Authors should submit their manuscript via journal's portal: https://rh.razavi.ac.ir/

Submission Requirements

1. Language

Manuscripts should be written in English. Spelling (British or American) should be consistent throughout. Avoid using contractions: e.g., 'cannot' rather than 'can't'.

2. Length

Original and review article submissions should be no less than 3000 words in length and no more than 8,000. For the short article and book review the length is between 2000 to 3000 words.

Manuscript Format and Structure

3. File Format

The file format for submissions is MS Word (.doc or .docx). The page size is A4 and whole text should be typed in Times New Roman font (font size: 11 for body and 9 for endnotes and bibliography).

4. Abstract and Keywords

Submissions should include an abstract (no less than 150 words and no more than 250 words) along with 3-5 keywords.

5. Titling

All titles and subtitles in the manuscript should be arranged numerically (English numbers not Roman).

6. Block Ouotes

All quotes three lines in length or more should be set out from the text and indented, leaving one blank line of text above and below.

7. Italics

Do not use bold in the text: use italics instead. Keep its use to a minimum.

8. Endnotes

All marginal but useful and important notes should be mentioned as endnotes not footnotes.

9. Transliteration

Arabic and Persian terms, as well as phrases quoted in these languages within the text, must be transliterated according to the <u>IJMES</u> standard.

References

All references (in text and reference list) should follow The Chicago Manual of Style, 17th edition.

**Non-English references are cited in the reference list in two ways. The title of the classic reference is transliterated and the original language of the work is mentioned at the end in parentheses. Example:

- Ibn Sina (Avicenna). 1985. al-Najat. Tehran: Intisharat-i Murtazavi. (In Arabic)

For contemporary references, the title is translated into English, and the original language of the work is mentioned at the end in parentheses. Example:

- Motahhari, Morteza. 1999. God in Human Life. Qom: Sadra. (In Persian)

All transliterations in references follow the **IJMES** standard.
